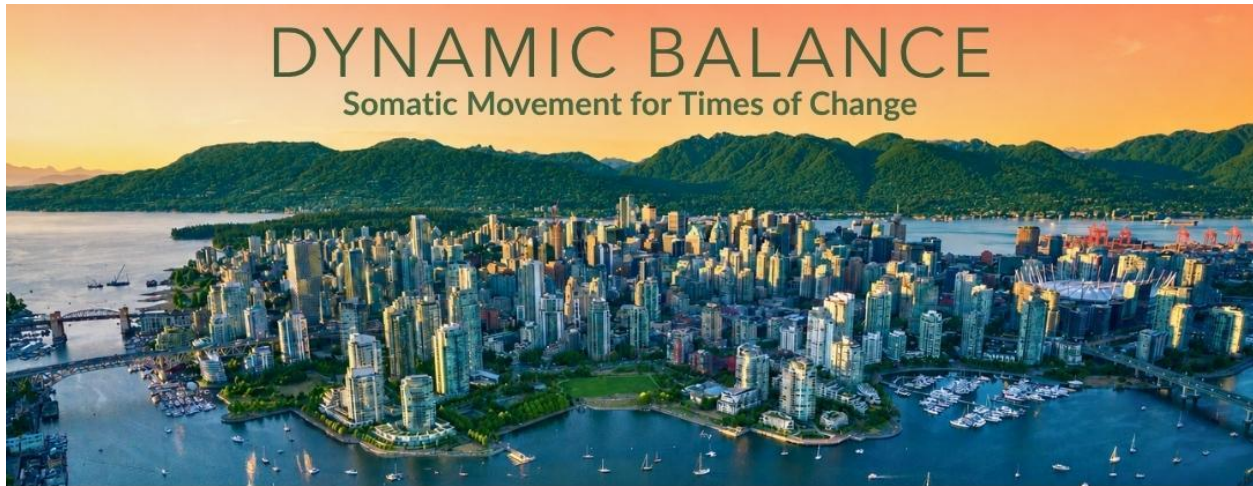

Invitation:

In a world of constant change, balance is not a destination but a living, responsive process. [Dynamic Balance: Somatic Movement for Times of Change](#) invites the global somatic movement community to explore how embodied practices cultivate resilience, presence, and creative adaptation.

Through presentations, experiential workshops, research, and dialogue, participants will engage with diverse somatic traditions and contemporary perspectives on movement, health, education, and social transformation.

Together, we will investigate how cultivating dynamic balance within ourselves and our interdependent relationships can strengthen our capacity to meet the challenges and opportunities of change.

Session Characteristics:

- We welcome proposals for experiential workshops, research presentations, and panel discussions.
- All sessions will be 75 minutes in length.
- All sessions will take place in meeting rooms with ample space to move.
- All session spaces will have speakers for amplified audio. Presenters are responsible for supplying the audio source (phone or computer) to be connected to the speakers. If you need access to projection during your session, please request it in your session proposal.
- Presenters are responsible for securing all rights and permissions from all rights holders to share music and other media during their presentation.
- If you have any questions regarding space set up and AV, please contact conferences@ismeta.org. If your questions impact your proposal submission, please contact us as early as possible; if they do not impact submission, please wait until after you have been accepted to discuss individual needs.
- We cannot honor requests to schedule a presentation on a specific day. Presenters are asked to attend the entire conference, September 16 - 18, 2027. Virtual presentation is not an option for this conference.

Proposal Guidelines:

- You may only submit one session as the main contact presenter. You may be a co-presenter on one other session submission. For sessions with more than one presenter, the group will select a “main contact” to submit their proposal via this form. Conference staff will communicate with the main contact regarding session acceptance and programming.
- The proposal abstract must address the conference theme (above) and support ISMETA’s [Scope of Practice and Code of Ethics for Somatic Movement Education and Therapy](#).
- Anyone is welcome to submit a proposal. If accepted, all presenters need to be or become an ISMETA member and register for the entire conference. If you are not already a Friend, Student, or Professional Member of ISMETA, please find information about becoming a member [here](#).

Proposals will be evaluated based on one or more of the following questions:

1. Does the proposal identify and effectively demonstrate one or more specific approaches to somatic movement knowledge, concepts, or practices?
2. Does the proposed session explore dynamic balance through awareness of physical, emotional, mental, or spiritual aspects of the human experience in movement?

3. Does the proposed session explore dynamic balance within individuals, in groups or with the natural world?

- **Session title** (65-character limit)
- **Session summary** - Please provide a one-paragraph summary of the session, including
 - The session type (experiential class, research presentation, or panel discussion)
 - One or more approaches to somatic movement knowledge, concepts, or practices
 - A clear connection to the conference theme of exploring dynamic balance with ourselves, others, or the natural world.
 - This text will clearly communicate the content and experience of your session to both proposal reviewers and conference attendees.
 - If selected, this description will be used in conference materials to entice attendees to come to your session.
 - *Maximum length = 1000 characters including spaces*
- **Session abstract** - Please provide a more in-depth description here. This text serves as a deeper explanation of what you will explore in your session and should:
 - identify the session type (experiential class, research presentation, or panel discussion)
 - connect with the conference theme
 - align with ISMETA's [Scope of Practice](#)
 - *Maximum length = 350 words*
- **Bios for each presenter** (200-word limit each, including website address and contact information)
- **AV Needs** - Please indicate whether or not you need speakers to play music and/or LCD projection.
- **Optional bibliography** - Feel free to provide a list of sources (e.g., books, articles, websites) you used to prepare your proposal.

Presenter Guidelines & Timeline: *All dates below are subject to change; any changes will be communicated clearly with presenters.*

- September 23, 2026: Call for Proposals opens
- November 2, 2026: Proposal submission deadline
- December 21, 2026: Proposal reviews are complete, and notifications are sent
- February 1, 2027: Presenter commitments are due, along with active ISMETA membership and discounted presenter conference registration fees

- All accepted presenters will receive the Super Early Bird Registration Discount fee of \$420. ISMETA is not able to cover the cost of accommodations for presenters, but a discount code for Coast Coal Harbour Hotel rooms will be provided.
